

Amicus Therapeutics, Inc.
Science and Technology Committee
Charter

Purpose

The Science and Technology Committee (“Committee”) is appointed by and acts on behalf of the Board of Directors (“Board”) of Amicus Therapeutics, Inc. (“Company”). The purpose of the Committee is to assist the Board in its oversight of matters relating to the Company’s strategic direction and investment in research and development and technology (“R&D”). The Committee is also responsible for identifying and discussing significant emerging trends and issues in science and technology and considering the impact on the Company.

The Committee shall have the authority and resources appropriate to discharge its responsibilities including the authority to obtain advice and assistance from consultants to advise the Committee and free access to members of management.

Composition and Meetings

The Committee shall consist of three or more independent directors designated and approved by the Board and members shall serve at the pleasure of the Board. A majority of the members must, in the judgment of the Board, have expertise in one of the following areas: medicine, scientific research, or drug development. The Committee shall meet at least twice a year.

Responsibilities and Duties

The Committee shall:

1. Identify and discuss new and emerging trends in pharmaceutical science, technology and regulation to ensure that the Company makes well informed choices in the investment of its R&D resources.
2. Review, evaluate and advise the Board regarding the quality, direction and competitiveness of the Company’s R&D programs.
3. Review, evaluate and advise the Board regarding the Company’s progress in achieving its strategic R&D goals and objectives.
4. Review and make recommendations to the Board on the Company’s internal and external investments in science and technology. For any external investments in R&D (e.g. potential acquisitions, alliances, collaborations, equity investments, contracts and grants) that require approval by the full Board, the Committee shall provide the Board with its recommendation on a scientific basis prior to Board action.
5. Evaluate its own performance annually.
6. Review and assess the adequacy of this Charter annually and recommend any proposed changes to the Board for approval.
